1 Corinthians 16:13-14

At Trinity & St Michael's Church of England and Methodist Primary School we strive to follow Jesus' example and do everything in love.

Our vision thread – do everything in love (1 Corinthians 16:14) – is at the heart of what it means to be Christian. The call to live marked by love is a consistent message found throughout Scripture. When the apostle Paul wrote to the church of Corinth, he instructed them to do everything in love. At Trinity & St Michael's, we aim to apply this instruction to our lives as we pursue our vision and strive to be more like Jesus. We actively seek to let love guide our thoughts, actions and words as we embrace a culture of togetherness.

Through living out our Christian Values we seek to equip our pupils with the skills to enable them to 'learn to love' and love to learn' so that they can become the very best they can be for themselves, for others and for our wonderful world. We hope all our pupils will become agents of change across all spheres of society.

'God's Kingdom is one of peace, love, joy, unity, equality, respect, forgiveness and compassion. It is a Kingdom where all can flourish, finding belonging, purpose and fulfilment. It is a Kingdom where we receive God's love and the promise of 'life in all its fullness' through Jesus' (John 10:10).

Likewise, following the words of John Wesley, "I look upon all the world as my parish; thus far I mean, that in, whatever part of it I am, I judge it meet, right, and my bounden duty to declare unto all that are willing to hear, the glad tidings of salvation." –Journal, June 11, 1739, we aim to ensure that all members of Trinity and St Michael's Church of England and Methodist Primary School have a clear understanding of Christian faith and are able to develop the skills required to reach out and engage with the world, to minister to the world and to be in mission to the world.



Our School Vision

Our Vision Statements

We live out our Christian values

We believe that the following of Christian Values creates well-rounded individuals. They are our basic and fundamental beliefs that guide and motivate our attitudes and actions. These values are shared and discussed regularly, not only in worship and R.E. but also in the wider curriculum especially PSRHE. This focus has an inspirational effect on all those at TSM and helps pupils understand the importance of being good members of our community. We believe and follow the teachings of Matthew 7:12 "do to others as you would have them do to you."

We strive to follow Jesus's example

During worship, across the curriculum and in our interactions, pupils and staff alike strive to follow the example of Jesus. By learning about the life and teachings of Jesus and by exploring our Christian values we ensure we have a strong Christian foundation of 'Doing everything in Love' Corinthians 16:14 at the heart of school.

We learn to love

Building on the pupils' understanding of what Christian love is and how we love is crucial. It is essential that pupils and staff understand that there is something to love in everything we see and do. Working and acting through love creates a positive and harmonious environment. This cannot be done without first helping our pupils and staff to 'Learn to Love'. This starts by helping pupils and adults to understand who they are, embrace their uniqueness and eventually learn to love themselves.

We love to learn

At TSM we are passionate about inspiring young people. The passion and enthusiasm that our staff demonstrate in their teaching and learning can be seen not only in the attitude that the staff have towards their endeavours, but also in the attitudes our pupils have towards their learning. When we ask someone to do something everyday, as we do when asking our pupils to learn, we must strive to ensure that they truly value their learning journey. Of course, this is not just when learning academic work, it is also when they are learning how to interact with peers and the wider community. Whatever children are learning, it is important that 'instructing and teaching children the way to go' is done with 'a loving eye' (Psalm 32:8) in order that we demonstrate how and why we embrace and love learning.

We develop a good relationship with ourselves and others

We truly believe that loving others only starts when we learn to understand ourselves, love the values that we hold and have a developing positive sense of self-worth. Through extensive extra-curricular opportunities, well differentiated lessons and targeted interventions, we ensure that pupils learn to understand themselves better and embrace what makes them unique. It is only through this that pupils will have the confidence and belief to 'Let their light shine before others' (Matthew 5:16) and share their love for themselves throughout their community and the wider world.

We develop a good relationship with the world around us

Well-rounded, confident pupils, are able to make a real difference to the world around them. At TSM we discuss the importance of 'treating the world as our parish' ensuring we are not simply looking after ourselves and loving others but looking beyond that too. We develop a sense of courageous advocacy in our pupils. We help them to develop their confidence and courage so that they are able to reach out and engage with the world to support causes they believe in. We empower them to make real changes in the face of some of the seemingly insurmountable giants the world faces. Environmental Issues, Poverty and Research into Health and Medicine such as Alzheimer's research are just some of the many causes TSM pupils have chosen to support. As with everything at TSM, understanding our relationship with the world is done with love and we ensure that, "Whatever we do, we work at it with all our hearts as working for the Lord" Colossians 3:23

We do everything in love

Love is at the centre of all we do at TSM. We inculcate a love for learning, a love for our community, a love for our world, a love of God and develop an understanding of our inner values and therefore an understanding of ourselves. Through nurturing this vision that all things are done through love, everything the pupils and staff do in our school is done positively, with empathy and compassion. The focus on Christian love is delivered through looking at biblical teachings and the virtues of the Christian church in the belief that, 'over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity,' Corinthians 3:14. Without love, all the other gifts of the Spirit fall short of the mark.



Our School Values

Christian Values are at the centre of everything we do at Trinity and St Michael's Church of England & Methodist Primary School (TSM). They help us to live out our Christian Vision "do everything in love". We believe our Christian Values form the framework on which our school community is built; they are embedded into our actions, attitudes, our planning, and policies. They help us to explicitly live out our school vision. We believe our values have the ability to colour and shape our character, our ethos, our aims and the learning experience of all members of our school community. We also recognise that our Christian values can be seen in other cultures and religions.

At TSM we believe that our core values empower our pupils to develop their spirituality and guide them in their personal development as effective learners and as good citizens. The Core Values we explore and strive to live by are threaded together by the value of Love. Our Core Values are:

Courage, Compassion, Forgiveness, Friendship, Perseverance, Respect and Thankfulness.

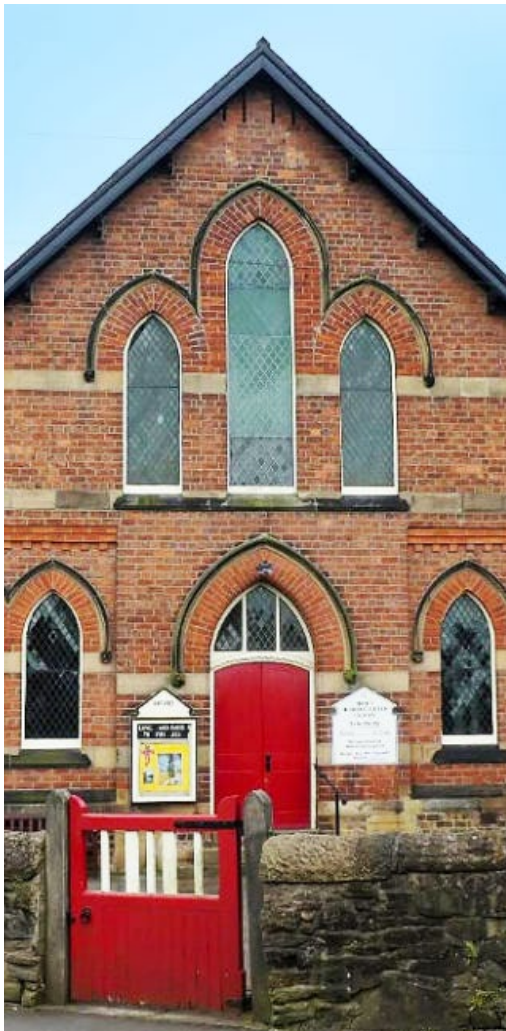

Trinity & St Michael's Church of England and Methodist Primary School takes inspiration and guidance from both village churches, which supports school in providing an education of the highest quality.
