# <u>Topic</u>

Then we will begin retracing Howard Carter's steps, deep into the tomb of Tutankhamun (let's hope we don't get cursed!). We will even learn all about the gory process of mummification that the Egyptians used to preserve the Pharoah's body!

## **English**

In English, we will remind ourselves of all the skills we have previously learnt. Then we will dive into our imagination to create some amazing writing pieces.

Our class novel will provide us with inspiration for our writing. We will step into the shoes of Lucy Pevensie as she enters Narnia, exploring what she will encounter and how she might feel. We will then create our own fairytale story that will take us through a portal (I wonder where we might end up?).

Next, we'll dive into amazing folktales where clever animals play tricks and teach us important lessons. You'll have the opportunity to create your own clever animals, daring tricks and interesting morals in a folktale that's all yours!

## Maths

To start with, we will recap our of knowledge of place value. This will help us master addition and subtraction using the formal written method. We will have lots of practical activities and resources so we can channel our inner mathematicians.

Next, we will move on to multiplication and division. We will be competing in lots of competitions and supermover sing-alongs, to help us embed these facts into our heads.

#### Science

In Science, we will begin by exploring electricity. We will consider how electricity is useful to us, before moving on to create our own circuits (we won't get electrocuted don't worry!).

After half term, we will move on to our sound unit. We will learn about how sound travels, and we will investigate how different materials can affect pitch.

Both topics will provide us with lots of opportunity for active investigations.

#### Art/DT

This term we will start with DT where we will use our knowledge of circuits to create a nightlight! Then we will move onto Art where we will make our own stencils to create a bright, tessellated design.

#### Music

In Music, we will become pop stars by playing rhythm and pitch games and learning the song 'Mamma Mia' by ABBA. I can't wait to hear your singing voices!

### Computing

This term we will focus on developing our understanding of technology and how we can use it. We will develop our researching skills, reinforcing safety online. Then we will create an eye-catching newspaper report linking to our RE learning.

PE will take place every Tuesday so please ensure your child arrives at school wearing the correct PE kit (joggers when it is cold). This term children will be focussing on Athletics and then they will move on to learn about different types of Invasion Games such as benchball.

### <u>RE</u>

In RE we will begin by exploring Christianity, with our first topic being 'God, David and the Psalms'. Then, as Christmas approaches, we will begin exploring the symbolism of light. Both topics will provide children opportunities to engage in deeper thinking and reflection.

#### French

In French, the children will continue to develop their language skills through the topic of 'Numbers, Calendars and Birthdays'.

# How to help at home:

Times tables: In Year 4, the times tables are extremely important as children will have to take the national times tables check later on in the year. We will spend time daily learning all the times tables up to 12x12, which the children will be tested on weekly. You can support your child further by practising with them at home and encouraging them to access the websites below.
